Ratification of Ministerial Appointments

WHEREAS Articles 2.4 and 4.4(b) of the *Constitution of the Métis Nation – Saskatchewan* (the “*Constitution*”) confer upon the President the sole discretion to assign Ministerial portfolios, subject to the approval of the Provincial Métis Council (PMC) and ratification by the Métis Nation Legislative Assembly (MNLA);

WHEREAS Article 2.4 of the *Constitution* further mandates that the assignment of Ministerial portfolios is restricted to members of the MNLA;

WHEREAS President Glen McCallum determined it is in the best interest of the Métis Nation – Saskatchewan (MN-S) that certain Ministerial portfolios be reorganized and reassigned to promote an efficient and responsive government; and

WHEREAS on July 27, 2020, the President directed that Ministerial portfolios be reassigned, effective that same date and until such time as the PMC confirm its approval of the same at its next duly held meeting – to be ratified at the next MNLA;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT the PMC hereby confirms its approval of the following Ministerial portfolio re-assignments and Ministerial appointments as directed by President Glen McCallum on July 27, 2020:
