Minutes of the Métis Nation – Saskatchewan, Métis Nation Legislative Assembly held May 25-26, 2024, at Prairieland Park, 503 Ruth Street West, Saskatoon, Saskatchewan, prepared by Diane Parsons, Recording Secretary.

**DAY 1 – MAY 25, 2024**

**GRAND ENTRY and CALL TO ORDER**

The Métis Nation – Saskatchewan (MN-S), Métis Nation Legislative Assembly (MNLA) commenced at approximately 9:00 a.m. with a Grand Entry procession led by Métis Veterans and others, carrying the flags of Canada, the Métis Nation, and the Province of Saskatchewan.

**OPENING PRAYER**

Elder Norman Fleury, Elder Louise Oelke and Elder Emile Janvier offered Opening Prayers.

**ANTHEMS**

Loretta King, Western Region 1, sang the “Métis National Anthem”. A recording of “O Canada” was presented.

**WELCOME FROM PRESIDENT CASSIDY CARON**

President Caron thanked Opening Ceremony participants for starting the Assembly in a good way and recognized MN-S’ progress toward self-government. She commended PMC leadership for their continued work which would benefit future generations of Métis citizens.

Vice-President Michelle LeClair presented President Caron with a blanket and a Saskatchewan Métis sash.

**STATE OF THE NATION ADDRESS**

**Glen McCallum, President, Métis Nation – Saskatchewan**

President McCallum expressed appreciation for the Elders’ prayers and noted the importance of the Grand Entry which provided a reminder of the objective of Métis ancestors on whose shoulders the Métis Nation was built.

Some of the MN-S’ accomplishments achieved since the previous MNLA were reviewed, including partnerships with Saskatchewan Polytechnic and the University of Saskatchewan, and progress in treaty negotiations with the Government of Canada. President McCallum emphasized the need for MN-S leaders to collaborate and inform citizens about the significance of these negotiations.

## BUSINESS AGENDA – MAY 25, 2024

### AGENDA VARIED

The order of the Agenda was varied during the Assembly. Items are presented in these minutes in the order in which they were considered.

#### 1. ROLL CALL OF REGISTERED DELEGATES

Richard Quintal, Clerk of the MNLA, conducted a roll call and confirmed a total of 86 registered voting Delegates in attendance<sup>1</sup>.

#### 2. AGENDA

It was agreed to remove “Order of the Day (Adoption of the Agenda)” from the “Consent Agenda” so that it could be considered separately. The “Consent Agenda” would be considered immediately after consideration of “Order of the Day (Adoption of the Agenda)”.

**WHEREAS** the Provincial Métis Council (PMC), at their duly held meeting on November 21, 2023, resolved that a Métis Nation Legislative Assembly (MNLA) would be called for May 24-26, 2024;

**WHEREAS** the PMC further resolved that the May 24-26, 2024, MNLA would be held in-person at 503 Ruth Street West, Prairieland Park, Saskatoon, Saskatchewan;

**WHEREAS** Articles 6.2 and 6.3 of the *Métis Nation of Saskatchewan Legislative Assembly Act* (the “Act”) as amended, directs the Clerk of the MNLA, as defined in Article 2.4 of the Act, to draft an agenda for the MNLA as directed by the PMC and to compile the necessary documentation for the Order of the Day;

**WHEREAS** an agenda is hereby proposed for the MN-S MNLA to be held on May 24-26, 2024;

**THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT** the MNLA on May 25, 2024, hereby approves the following agenda for the Spring 2024 MNLA of May 24-26, 2024.

The Assembly recessed at 11:15 a.m. and reconvened at 11:45 a.m.

#### **ROLL CALL**

The Deputy Clerk of the MNLA (an MN-S Intern) conducted a roll call and confirmed a total of 89 Delegates in attendance.

#### **2.1 Consent Agenda (Continued)**

The recommendations approved in the Consent Agenda (as provided with the MNLA agenda), are as follows:

*Recommendation on the “Appointment of Dumont’s Scouts for the Spring 2024 MNLA”*

“WHEREAS Article 8.1 of the *Métis Nation of Saskatchewan Legislative Assembly Act* provides that Dumont’s Scouts be appointed by the Provincial Métis Council to maintain order and procedure during the Métis Nation Legislative Assembly (MNLA);

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT the MNLA appoint the following individuals to be the Dumont’s Scouts for the Spring 2024 MNLA: John Belanger, Hailey Burnouf, Reina LaCroix, Felix Merasty, and Josie Searson.”

*Recommendation on “Accepting the Reactivation of Eastern Region 2A Locals”*

“WHEREAS Locals #13 and #47 (the Locals) have been ratified by the Métis Nation Legislative Assembly (MNLA) in accordance with Article 7.3 of the *Constitution of the Métis Nation – Saskatchewan* (the “*Constitution*”), which states:

*“New Locals can be admitted by the Regional Councils provided this decision is ratified by the Métis Nation Legislative Assembly (MNLA), and the requirements herein are met”;*

WHEREAS the Locals later ceased operations, including their participation in the MNLA, but were never dissolved by the Regional Council and the MNLA pursuant to Article 7.4 of the *Constitution*, which states:

*“Locals can be dissolved by the Regional Council provided this decision is ratified by the Métis Nation Legislative Assembly and the requirements herein are no longer met”;*

WHEREAS the Locals have since resumed activities and warrant that they continue to meet the Constitutional requirements for Locals, including Article 7.2 of the *Constitution* which states:

*“The Locals shall be made up of at least nine members”;* and

WHEREAS the Locals seek to rejoin the MNLA;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT the MNLA accepts the reactivation of Yorkton Local #13, and Crescent Lake Local #47 in Eastern Region 2A and their membership within the MNLA.”

Representatives from Yorkton Local #13, and Crescent Lake Local #4, were invited to participate as voting Delegates.

**3. RESOLUTION TO SUPPORT OUT OF PROVINCE CITIZENSHIP**

During discussion, comments were offered on out of province citizens being ineligible to vote in MN-S elections, access MN-S programming, or hold membership in a MN-S Local.

**Agenda Varied**

Discussion on Item 3 – “Resolution to Support Out of Province Citizenship” was suspended to now allow for the previously scheduled “Signing Ceremony”.

**SIGNING CEREMONY: Agreements with Saskatchewan Polytechnic and the University of Saskatchewan**

Baljit Singh, Vice-President Research, University of Saskatchewan, Representatives from Saskatchewan Polytechnic, President Glen McCallum, Vice-President Michelle LeClair, Secretary Lisa McCallum and Minister Wendy Gervais, participated in the signing of a Citizenship Agreement with Saskatchewan Polytechnic, and a Research Institute Agreement with the University of Saskatchewan.

**Health Break**

The Assembly recessed at 1:10 p.m. and reconvened at 2:05 p.m.

**ROLL CALL**

The Deputy Clerk of the MNLA (an MN-S Intern) conducted a roll call and confirmed quorum.

**3. RESOLUTION TO SUPPORT OUT OF PROVINCE CITIZENSHIP (Continued)**

During continued discussion, comments were offered on the benefit of reconnecting with MN-S citizens residing outside Saskatchewan, including those who had been adopted and removed from the province as children.

**Health Break**

The Assembly recessed at 2:45 p.m. and reconvened at 3:00 p.m.

**ROLL CALL**

Richard Quintal, Clerk of the MNLA, conducted a roll call and confirmed a total of 93 registered voting Delegates in attendance.

**It was MOVED (Glen McCallum) and SECONDED (Michelle LeClair)**

**WHEREAS** the *Constitution of the Métis Nation – Saskatchewan* (the “*Constitution*”) includes a definition of citizenship that does not include a Saskatchewan residency requirement;

**WHEREAS** the Métis Nation Legislative Assembly (MNLA) amended the *Métis Nation of Saskatchewan Citizenship Act* (the “*Citizenship Act*”) in 2021 to provide for a process of registering eligible persons as Métis citizens based on the definition of Métis contained in the *Constitution*;

**WHEREAS** the *Constitution* requires a connection to the Métis homeland and Saskatchewan is the heart of the homeland, and the Métis Nation – Saskatchewan (MN-S) will continue to give life to this connection through holding to the national definition;

**WHEREAS** at community consultations in 2019, 2021, 2022, 2023, and 2024 citizens supported removing any provincial residency requirements for MN-S citizenship;

**WHEREAS** the MN-S recognizes through community consultations, the importance of holding citizenship to out of province individuals;

**WHEREAS** the MNLA recognizes that Métis individuals who are eligible for MN-S citizenship but reside outside of Saskatchewan are not currently eligible for programs and services provided by MN-S;

**WHEREAS** the MN-S reaffirms its commitment to the preservation and celebration of Métis culture, heritage, and rights, while fostering greater solidarity and cooperation among Métis people residing both within and outside of Saskatchewan ensuring that all Métis people can stay connected to the Heartland wherever they reside;

**THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT** the MNLA directs the Clerk of the MNLA to ensure the *Constitution* and the *Citizenship Act* are complied with, so that all applications for citizenship from Métis who meet the definition of citizenship in the *Constitution*, are approved and can remain connected to the Heartland wherever they reside; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT** the MNLA directs the Chief Executive Officer and the Registrar of the MN-S to develop guidelines for the implementation of this resolution.

**BE IT RESOLVED THAT** the Métis Nation Legislative Assembly (MNLA) approves extending adjournment of the May 25-26, 2024 MNLA on May 25, 2024, to 5:00 p.m.

**CARRIED (MNLA240525-04)**

*66 Delegates voted in favour*

*17 Delegates voted in opposition*

*0 Delegates abstained from the vote*

#### **4. TABLING AMENDED LEGISLATION**

Secretary McCallum reviewed Appendix A, “MN-S Constitutional Reform 2024-2025 Timeline”, and Appendix B, “Summary of Proposed Amendments” from the “Provincial Secretary’s Report” and outlined the process to bring the Phase 1 amended legislation to the Fall 2024 MNLA, for consideration. The Secretary commended the contributions from MN-S Elders and citizens and noted that further Phase 2 legislative reforms would be prioritized in 2025.

It was confirmed that amendments would be introduced for consideration at the Fall 2024 MNLA, to the following: *Constitution of the Métis Nation – Saskatchewan, Saskatchewan Métis Election Act, Citizenship Act and Métis Nation of Saskatchewan Legislative Assembly Act.*

#### **5. MN-S OPERATING BUDGET FOR 2024-2025**

Marg Friesen, Minister of Finance, presented the “Draft Budget 2024-2025”, and highlighted the MN-S’ commitment to transparency and fiscal soundness while bringing vital programs and services to Métis citizens. During a presentation on the budget, comments were offered on:

- An increase in revenue over the prior year and continued work to make life more affordable for Métis citizens

- Development of a budgeting cycle which contributed to effective goal setting and achievement of targets
- Some of the MN-S' recent and upcoming achievements and priorities, including:
  - o Support for cultural programming, regional housing strategies and community childcare enhancement grants
  - o Creation of a land-based addiction recovery facility and services
  - o Funding to support home buyers' grants, green initiatives and post secondary education.

Matt Vermette, Chief Operating Officer, and Zareen Jawaid, Director of Budgeting and Reporting, reviewed the 2024-2025 Budget Summary.

During discussion, comments were offered on:

- Funding for Les Filles de Madeleine being contingent on the MN-S' receipt of audited financial statements, and establishment of the MN-S Women's Ad Hoc Committee
- The process for allocating unspent Urban Programming for Indigenous Peoples (UPIP) funding
- Prioritizing increased funding for Locals' administrative costs.

### **Agenda Varied**

Due to time constraints, further consideration of Item 5 – “MN-S Operating Budget for 2024-2025” was postponed to May 26, 2024.

### **ASSEMBLY ADJOURNED**

The May 25-26, 2024 MN-S MNLA adjourned on May 25, 2024, at 5:00 p.m. after confirming that the Assembly would reconvene on May 26, 2024, at 9:00 a.m. Elder Deborah Smith offered a Closing Prayer. Elder Josie Searson offered a Meal Blessing.

## **DAY 2 – MAY 26, 2024**

### **OPENING PRAYERS AND CALL TO ORDER**

The May 25-26, 2024 MN-S MNLA reconvened on May 26, 2024, at 9:15 a.m. Elder Max Morin and Elder Rita Ducharme offered Opening Prayers.

### **ROLL CALL**

Richard Quintal, Clerk of the MNLA, conducted a roll call and confirmed a total of 95 registered voting Delegates in attendance.

### **RULES OF THE HOUSE**

Deputy Speaker Merelda Fiddler-Potter reviewed the origin and intent of the “Rules of the House”.

### **5. MN-S OPERATING BUDGET FOR 2024-2025 (Continued)**

During continued discussion, comments were offered on:

- Restrictions on funding originating from the Government of Canada
- Insufficient funding available to hold a third MNLA in 2024
- The MN-S' goal of allocating UPIP funding for use by Locals by December 31, 2024; any remaining funding should be allocated before March 31, 2025
- Evaluating the financial requirements to run Locals effectively
- Providing transparency related to MN-S financials and spending.

### **Health Break**

The Assembly recessed at 10:15 a.m. and reconvened at 10:40 a.m.

### **5. MN-S OPERATING BUDGET FOR 2024-2025 (Continued)**

During continued discussion, comments were offered on:

- MN-S discussions with the Provincial Government and the Red Cross in response to deteriorating road conditions, flood and fire emergencies
- Accounting principles that provided a funding buffer to ensure smooth and consistent operations
- Continued advocacy with the Government of Canada and commitment by the MN-S to provide support for Local Presidents.

### **ROLL CALL**

Richard Quintal, Clerk of the MNLA, conducted a roll call and confirmed a total of 95 registered voting Delegates in attendance.

#### **It was MOVED (Marg Friesen) and SECONDED (Loretta King)**

**WHEREAS** the Métis Nation-Saskatchewan (MN-S) adheres to established financial standards and accounting policies for all funds received on behalf of Métis citizens of Saskatchewan;

**WHEREAS** the MN-S government is committed to delivering on the commitments made to its funding partners and citizens;

**WHEREAS** the Provincial Métis Council approved the 2024-2025 Draft Operating Budget at their duly held meeting on February 22, 2024 and recommended it to the Métis Nation Legislative Assembly (MNLA) for ratification;

**THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT** the MNLA approves the draft MN-S Operating Budget for 2024-2025, as presented on May 26, 2024.

**CARRIED (MNLA240626-01)**

*59 Delegates voted in favour*

*3 Delegates voted in opposition*

*0 Delegates abstained from the vote*

### **6. PRESENTATION OF THE KING'S CORONATION MEDAL**

Russell Mirasty, the Lieutenant Governor of Saskatchewan, presented the King's Coronation Medal to President Glen McCallum, in recognition of his significant contributions to the community, province and country.

### **Health Break**

Elder Albert LeClerc offered a Meal Blessing. The Assembly recessed at 11:50 a.m. and reconvened at 1:00 p.m.

- 7. KWAYASKASTASOWIN / SETTING THINGS RIGHT: A Métis Judiciary Designed with Métis People**  
Marilyn Poitras, System and Design Consultant, presented an overview (by video) of *Kwayaskastasowin*, a model for a Métis judiciary, noting that the consultation team of over 30 people had spoken with over 1,000 people across the province, over two years. Thanks were extended to Elders for their guidance. During discussion, comments were offered on:
- The generational impacts of incarceration on an entire family
  - An overview of *Gladue* principles and their lack of impact on recidivism
  - Holding a conference to explore language, and ensure that traditional Métis ways of knowing were incorporated into the Kwayaskastasowin model
  - Ongoing consultation with community anticipated regarding the Kwayaskastasowin model and further discussion at the Fall 2024 MNLA
  - Establishing an appeal or review body, and involving diverse individuals in deliberation and decision-making
  - The limitation of a Métis judiciary to decide only on laws exclusively enacted by the MN-S.
- 8. KWAYASKASTASOWIN JUDICIARY ACT**  
Vice-President LeClair, Minister of Justice and Environment, confirmed that the draft Judiciary Act would be introduced for consideration at the Fall 2024 MNLA.

**CONCLUSION**

The May 25-26, 2024, MNLA concluded on May 26, 2024, at approximately 2:35 p.m. Thanks were extended to the Speaker, Deputy Speaker, Delegates and others. Elder Norman Fleury, Elder Emile Janvier, and Elder Louise Oelke offered Closing Prayers.
