Revisions to the Provincial Métis Council (PMC) Conduct Policy

WHEREAS the Métis Nation – Saskatchewan (MN-S) recognizes the distinctiveness of Métis identity, culture, values and language, including Knowledge Keepers, Kih̓tēyak, Lii Vyeu Moond (“the Old Ones” or Elders), Youth, Women and other distinctive resources, which are incorporated into proposals and decisions of the Provincial Métis Council (PMC);

WHEREAS the MN-S is committed to promoting transparency, integrity, and accountability in the conduct of its elected members of the PMC;

WHEREAS the PMC has previously established frameworks for conduct and governance through the “Code of Conduct – Conflict of Interest” (Resolution #180302-03) (Code of Conduct) and the “Handbook for the Executive, Ministers, and Members of the Provincial Métis Council” (Resolution #191108-08) (Handbook);

WHEREAS in June 2021, the PMC directed that a Technical Review Committee be formed to review the Handbook and develop recommendations for its continued refinement, improvement and enhancement to support good governance and sound processes within the MN-S government (Resolution #210618-04);

WHEREAS the PMC, at its duly held meeting on June 25, 2025, approved the adoption of the “Provincial Métis Council Conduct Policy” (the “*Conduct Policy*”), which aligned with current practices and distinctions-based governance of the PMC and replaced the Handbook and Code of Conduct (Resolution #250625-08);

WHEREAS it is recognized as a best practice to regularly review and update governance policies to ensure they remain clear, effective, and aligned with evolving needs and priorities; and

WHEREAS the existing *Conduct Policy* remains in force until such time as a revised policy is duly approved, ensuring continuous standards of conduct;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT the PMC directs that the MN-S undertake a comprehensive review of the *Conduct Policy* within the Ministry of Self-Government and Self-Determination to ensure it remains clear, effective, and aligned with the principles of good governance;

FURTHER BE IT RESOLVED THAT the review process shall include dedicated review sessions with the PMC during which PMC members may bring forward proposed amendments for consideration;

FURTHER BE IT RESOLVED THAT the MN-S public service, including policy and legal expertise, shall provide support for the revision process, as required, to facilitate the review and development of proposed revisions; and

FURTHER BE IT RESOLVED THAT the proposed revisions arising from the review must be brought forward for consideration and approval by the PMC at a duly convened meeting.
