Establishing a Constitutional Reform Committee

WHEREAS the Métis Nation – Saskatchewan (MN-S) recognizes the distinctiveness of Métis identity, culture, values and language, including Knowledge Keepers, Kih̓tēyak, Lii Vyeu Moond (“the Old Ones” or Elders), Youth, Women and other distinctive resources, which are incorporated into proposals and decisions of the Provincial Métis Council (PMC);

WHEREAS Article 2.1 of the *Constitution of the Métis Nation – Saskatchewan* (the “*Constitution*”) provides that the Métis Nation Legislative Assembly (MNLA) is the governing authority of the MN-S;

WHEREAS Article 3.4(a) of the *Constitution* authorizes the PMC to establish committees to carry out the activities and functions of the MN-S and directives of the MNLA;

WHEREAS the MNLA has identified constitutional reform as a Nation-building priority to strengthen governance, accountability, and public trust (MNLA Resolution #190414-11);

WHEREAS the MNLA has directed the MN-S, through the Ministry of Self-Government and Self-Determination, to initiate a distinctions-based constitutional reform and governance alignment process outlined in the May 23-24, 2026 MNLA Resolution #MNLA260523-06;

WHEREAS pursuant to the Resolution, the MNLA has further directed the PMC to establish a Constitutional Reform Committee (Committee) to support the leadership, coordination, and advancement of the reform process; and

WHEREAS pursuant to the Resolution, the MNLA directed that the Committee will be co-chaired by the Minister of Self-Government and Self-Determination and the Minister of Community and Locals;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT the PMC hereby establishes a Constitutional Reform Committee which will be co-chaired by the Minister of Self-Government and Self-Determination and the Minister of Community and Locals, and consist of an additional five to seven members of the MNLA representing the Northern, Central, and Southern regions;

FURTHER BE IT RESOLVED THAT the PMC directs that an expression of interest to serve on the Committee be issued from the Office of the President to the members of the MNLA within 30 days, and that applications received by the Office of the President will be reviewed by the Committee Co-Chairs and President, and the President will make formal appointments to the Committee;

FURTHER BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Committee Co-Chairs shall facilitate the development of Terms of Reference for the Committee and bring it forward to the PMC for approval and to the MNLA for ratification at the Fall 2026 MNLA; and

FURTHER BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Committee shall provide an interim report to the Fall 2026 MNLA outlining engagement activities, issues identified, governance and legal gaps, options for reform, recommended next steps, and any proposed constitutional or legislative amendments.
