Significant MN–S Investment in Regina and area Citizens

September 2, 2026 – The Heartland of the Métis, Treaty 4 Territory, Regina, SK – The Métis Nation–Saskatchewan government announces a large development in Regina’s southwest. A 3-acre lot in the new Westera neighbourhood will soon house an Early Learning and Child Care Centre, a Ma Faamii service hub, and a 16-suite supportive housing unit, bringing much needed supports to citizens in the south region.

MN–S President Glen McCallum said, “Over the last nine years, our government has been identifying gaps in community services and addressing them accordingly. The Regina project helps connect our citizens to government programs and services. This is your government in action and what Métis self-government is about.”

A former educator herself, MN–S WR3 Regional Director, Veterans Minister Wendy Gervais acknowledged the first day of school and the significance of this major regional development. “Our Métis children deserve to grow up knowing who they are, where they come from, and that their culture and heritage matter. And that is what I see happening here. I see a place where our children will be cared for, where our citizens can access the supports they need, and where families can build a stronger future. That is nation-building.”

A Place to Heal

Partnering with CMHC, the MN–S government is constructing a transitional living complex for women, children, and transitional housing unit in Regina to support women, children and 2SLGBTQQIA+ individuals fleeing domestic violence. The two-storey, 15,244 square foot building will contain citizen services that provide education, employment and counselling support, with childcare for the residents in the adjacent ELCC centre.

“Interpersonal violence is more prevalent in Indigenous communities,” said MN–S Minister of Health Beverly Fullerton. “Though the issues vary, most incidents occur because of intergenerational trauma, social conditions, health, addictions or homelessness. The MN–S government is including on site supportive services to the residents to set them up for future success.”



Métis Architects will ensure the work being done is Métis-distinct and culturally sensitive to the residents. The supportive housing unit couldn't have been possible without Canada Mortgage and Housing (CMHC), and the Government of Saskatchewan.

There will be a residential application process that will be available to Métis citizens prior to the opening next year.

Early Learning and Child Care

As part of the developing Métis Child Care Centre network in Saskatchewan, previously announced by the MN–S and Saskatchewan governments, the 90-space Early Learning and Child Care Centre (ELCC) in Regina will be conveniently located next to the supportive housing complex for residents with children living there. The 26,000 square foot building is distinctively designed by Métis architects and construction companies. A general contractor will be selected through a public tendering process.

The design features include a gabled roof and wall cladding inspired by the Red River/Hudson Bay frame style houses. The interior white walls with warm wood ceilings with colour accents, represent Métis beadwork.

Early Learning and Child Care (ELCC) Minister Ryan Carriere said, “It’s important that our children are immersed in their Métis culture at a young age so they grow up with a strong sense of self. Our educators are selected based on their teaching styles and strong ability to instill Métis values they’ll practice in their older lives.”

Ma Faamii

“Ma Faamii is an important connector between our MN–S government and our citizens,” said Child and Family Services Minister Loretta King, who stressed programs and services are a government priority.

Establishing a provincial Ma Faamii network ensures all Métis citizens have equal access to information and assistance where needed. The Regina Ma Faamii service hub will serve citizens locally and in surrounding areas.

This latest centre will join the operations in Saskatoon and North Battleford and this week, Yorkton. Each Ma Faamii represents an MN–S government investment in Métis citizens across the province.
